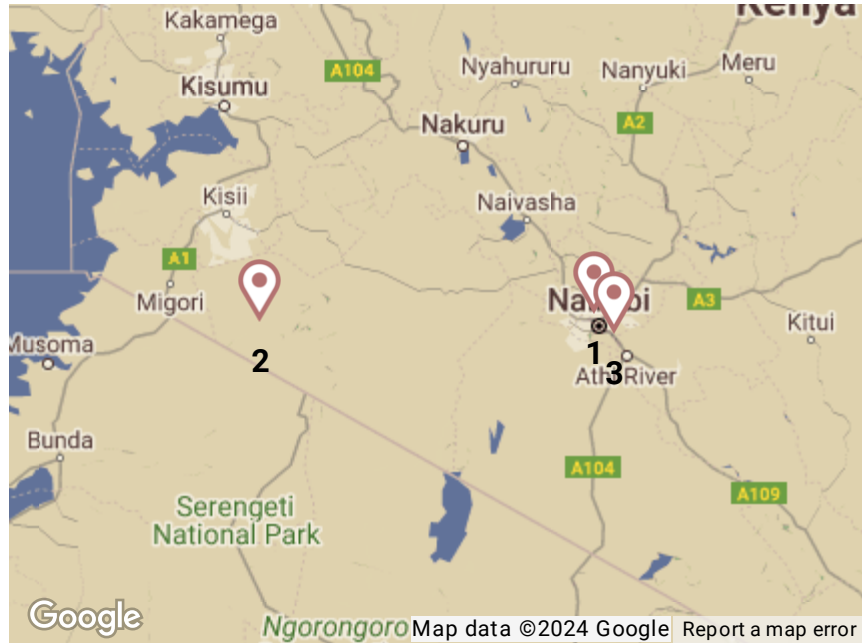

November 2 | Sheldrick Wildlife Trust

A Brief History

Founded in 1977 by Dr Dame Daphne Sheldrick DBE, in memory of her late husband, famous naturalist and founding Warden of Tsavo East National Park, David Leslie William Sheldrick MBE, the Sheldrick Wildlife Trust claims a rich and deeply rooted family history in wildlife and conservation.

Since the death of her husband, Daphne, and her family, lived and worked in the Nairobi National Park where they built The David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust and its pioneering Orphans' Project into the global force for wildlife conservation that is today. Daphne's daughter Angela worked alongside her mother running the Trust for twenty years, and since Daphne's passing in 2018 continues the mission with passion and vigor ably supported by her husband Robert Carr-Hartley, their two sons Taru and Roan and the Sheldrick Wildlife Trust team.

The Nairobi Nursery

The Trust is best known for its work on elephants, and although the Orphans project is the heart and soul of the Trust, the organisation has now expanded to veterinary units, anti-poaching units, community projects and the saving habitat initiative.

One can visit the Trust every day of the week, excluding Christmas day.

Note: visits require advance booking.

November 2 | Visit to the Giraffe Centre

Nairobi Activities

The Giraffe Centre is the creation of the African Fund for Endangered Wildlife (A.F.E.W. Kenya), a Kenyan non-profit organisation. The main purpose is to educate Kenyan school children and youth on their country's wildlife and environment, as well as give local and international visitors an opportunity to come into close contact with the world's tallest species, the giraffe. The centre is home to the endangered Rosthchilds Giraffe and visitors have the opportunity to get up close and personal with them!

Entry fees are \$15 per adult and \$7.50 per child.

November 2 | Nairobi Activities

Karen Blixen Museum

Karen Blixen Museum was once the centre piece of a farm at the foot of the Ngong Hills owned by Danish Author Karen and her Swedish Husband, Baron Bror von Blixen Fincke. Located 10km from the city centre, the Museum belongs to a different time period in the history of Kenya. The farm house gained international fame with the release of the movie 'Out of Africa' an Oscar winning film based on Karen's an autobiography by the same title.

The Museum is open to the Public every day (9.30 am to 6pm) including weekends and public holidays. Rates are USD\$12 per adult and USD\$6 per child.

November 3 | Fairview Coffee Estate

Experience premium coffee and learn from the experts.

A little bit about Fairview Estate

In the heart of Kenya's Central Highlands, home to the world's finest coffee, lies Fairview Coffee Estate. This beautiful coffee farm with nearly 100 acres under coffee is situated 1,750 meters above sea level. The farm is irrigated by the Riara River that is in turn fed by streams from the Kenyan Highlands. Since the early 1900's, Fairview Estate's fertile soils have produced high quality coffee through the use of holistic production methods that take our customers concerns for a healthy environment seriously.

Fairview introduces the concept of coffee tourism to their visitors, who get to experience a coffee tour around our coffee farm, getting to learn about the Fairview Estate coffee brand and it's production.

November 4 - 8 | Hot Air Balloon

Activity overview

A balloon flight over the Maasai Mara is widely considered a bucketlist activity that offers a serene and spectacular experience floating over the vast, lush, and game filled plains.

A lift off at dawn means you watch the sun rise as you head in a generally western direction. Flights usually last close to an hour and depending on the take off spot you float over riverine woodlands, watching hippos return to their daytime refuges and crocodiles basking on sandbanks. Sometimes predators and large antelope herds can be spotted below, pointed out by your experienced captain.

After the flight you will be met by the trailing transfer vehicles and taken to a pre-prepared picnic breakfast, beautifully set up in an idyllic spot on the plains.

November 4 - 8 | Maasai Mara



Area Overview

Named in honour of the Maasai people who call this corner of Africa home, the Mara is world renowned for its exceptional populations of lion, leopard, cheetah, buffalo, black rhino and a thriving elephant population. Around July of each year, the Great Migration arrives in the Maasai Mara National Reserve for its annual four-month stay.

The Mara Triangle

West of the Mara River, beneath the Oloololo Escarpment and bordered by Tanzania to the south, lies the jewel of this great reserve: the Mara Triangle. Not only is this the most productive part of the entire Serengeti-Mara ecosystem in terms of grass nutrition, but it is also spectacularly scenic. The huge grassy plains are dotted with widely spaced Balanites trees that give the landscape an almost manicured look which, together with the steep-sided escarpment and broad Mara River, provides a breath-taking backdrop for wildlife photographers.

The Mara Triangle has been most efficiently managed by the Mara Conservancy for the past 15 years – evidenced in the guides' discipline, successful anti-poaching efforts and impressive road infrastructure. For much of the year, the Mara Triangle has the lowest density of visitors in the Greater Maasai Mara, with just two lodges within its perimeters and a few on the northern border.

November 4 - 8 | Maasai Mara

Covering over 500 square kilometres, the Mara Triangle includes seasonal marshes, open plains and gallery forest habitats, providing homes for a great diversity of mammals and birds. This is Angama Mara's wonderland.

November 4 - 8 | Angama Mara



Property Overview

Angama is inspired by the Swahili word for 'suspended in mid-air'. Located high above the floor of Africa's Great Rift Valley, Angama Mara is a remarkable safari lodge overlooking Kenya's world famous Maasai Mara. Here guests will find a lodge where everything is as it ought to be: two intimate camps of just 15 Tented Suites each, access to the Mara below, tailor-made safari days and a famously warm Kenyan welcome.

The lodge's remarkable setting overlooks what many safari travellers deem the finest game reserve on the continent, Kenya's Maasai Mara. Angama Mara's Tented Suites stretch out over two kopjes on the edge of the Olololo Escarpment. The third kopje is immediately recognisable as the site where many of the most memorable scenes from *Out of Africa* were filmed.

Experience & Activities

Safaris

The Maasai Mara never fails to deliver extraordinary wildlife sightings: prides of lion, solitary leopards, the shy black rhino and abundant herds of elephant and buffalo are all to be found here in and amongst bountiful plains game. Head out at sunrise with a picnic breakfast and be back for lunch; head out after breakfast with a picnic lunch; or a favourite, pack two picnics and spend the whole day exploring the Mara.

Hot-Air Ballooning

Watch the balloon as it is inflated and just before dawn, lift off into the skies, witnessing the sunrise and a multitude of animals below while floating over the Mara. End with a champagne breakfast in the middle of the endless plains.

Walking Safaris

Guests have access to a huge tract of wilderness along the escarpment. Escorted by a Maasai Naturalist Guide, walks can be as long or short as guests prefer. Discover the smaller details — plants, birds, insects and animals and the role they play in traditional Maasai beliefs and customs.

Photography

Visit Angama Mara's Photographic Studio for a private tutorial with the on-site wildlife photographer who will help guests come to grips with their camera. Hire photographic equipment or learn more about the editing process on the large-screen Apple desktops. Explore the Mara on a private photographic safari with one of the resident specialist Guides. For those who prefer to put down their cameras, the in-house photographer can capture their special moments in a professional photoshoot.

The Shamba

Explore Angama Mara's one-acre kitchen garden followed by a lunch under towering moth trees. Crusty bread, local cheese, chilled rosé and the freshest of salads served with the Mara as a backdrop.

Out of Africa Picnics

Intimate private picnics for two (maximum four) on the Out of Africa kopje featured on the movie's iconic poster. Checked blankets, comfy cushions, canvas chairs, a picnic and sparkling wine on ice — everything you could need for elegant romance.

November 4 - 8 | Angama Mara

Sundowner Boma

Traditional dawa (local mojito) in hand, toast the sun as it descends from the vantage point of the lodge's Sundowner Boma to the sound of Maasai warriors as they perform singing, dancing and jumping.

Forest BBQ

Gather in a lantern-lit forest for dinner cooked over the coals. Guests dine family-style at long wooden tables, off enamel plates. It's fun, relaxed and most of all, delicious.

Visit the Beading Studio

Leading off the Safari Shop is a sunny studio for Maasai ladies who come daily to bead bespoke items. Guests can try their hand at beading or perhaps have them bead a name bracelet or item of their clothing.

Run with a Kenyan

Join the Angama Running Club and see how you fare against this nation of great athletes as you jog along the escarpment with the possibility of encountering plains game along the way.

In and Around the Lodge

Take a stroll up the Out of Africa kopje, orientate yourself and catch up on the latest sightings in the Map Room, burn up some energy in the Fitness Room, put in some lengths in the 12-metre Swimming Pool, catch a few rays or do some shopping in the Safari Shop. Guests can also browse the numerous books in the Library, watch a movie from the African film collection or treat themselves to an in-tent massage.

Family Suite

Two sets of family suites are available — two standard tents connected by a secure interleading passageway. Each set can sleep up to two adults and four children. Guests can enjoy their space and privacy, with the peace of mind of being able to move safely and easily between the two Tented Suites.

The Tented Suites each feature a super king, extra-length bed, a handsome drinks cabinet, vanity with double basins, separate w/c, writing desk and a Butler's Lobby allowing for the discreet delivery of early morning tea and coffee.

Diani Beach



Area Overview

Many consider Diani Beach, and its extension Galu Beach, to be not only one of the most beautiful beaches in Africa, but likely in the world. It is about 17 km (10 mi) long, from the Kongo River in the north to Galu Beach in the south (the southern point of reference is an old Baobab tree). The coast's white sand and warm clear turquoise waters are protected by the continuous coral reef, making for very good fishing and snorkeling. Diani is a popular spot for kitesurfing and sky diving and is not far from the Shimba Hills National Reserve, which looks out over the Indian Ocean.

There are multiple shopping centers strewn along the main road, above which the local Colobus Trust has erected a number of “monkey bridges” to protect the local black and white colobus monkeys. The 16th century Kongo Mosque is the last remaining ancient Swahili structure in Diani, located at the northern tip of Diani Beach, where the Kongo River flows into the ocean. To the south of Diani, before the Tanzania border, are the famous slave caves of Shimoni and a world famous fishing outpost that serves as the starting point for day trips on sailing dhows to Kisite Island.

With a population of over 100,000 inhabitants, the Diani/Ukunda urban area is one of the largest at the Kenyan coast and forms part of the Mombasa metropolitan region. A small airstrip, Ukunda Airport, is located between the beach area and the Mombasa-Lunga Lunga road.

Mombasa



Area Overview

Mombasa is Kenya's second largest city. With a prime location on the Indian Ocean's shores and one of the deepest ports on Africa's eastern seaboard, Mombasa has commanded a strategic and influential trade presence throughout the middle and far east since from as far back as 900 AD. Originally a Bantu/Swahili settlement, over the last thousand years Mombasa changed hands between the Omani arabs and the Portuguese and finally came under British administration in 1895. The Kilindini Harbour was inaugurated a year later when construction began on the Uganda Railway.

A lot of the city's culture and architecture can be attributed to Swahili and Arabic influences and is most prominently on display in the Old Town section of the main island. Fort Jesus was built by the Portuguese in 1593 and commands an impressive position at the head of the island opposite a famous surf break called English Point.

Mombasa was, in essence, the capital until the building of the railway inland founded the 'Place of Cool Waters' (Nairobi). One can ride the new version of the 'Lunatic Express' between the two cities and lots of Kenyans do so to holiday at the coast, enjoying the warm sea waters, exotic seafood dishes and a whole variety of watersports. The beaches north and south of the city attract tourists from all over the world and the city is serviced by an international airport.

Lamu



Area Overview

To visit the mystical island of Lamu is to take a step back in time. There is only one vehicle on the island, otherwise people walk, ride donkeys, or sail on traditional Arab sailboats called *Dhows* or *Ngalawas*. The ocean side of the island is fronted by a huge, eight mile long deserted beach, with commanding dunes that shield the coconut and mango plantations and small villages behind. At the heart of the island is the Old Town, where narrow winding paths and traditional Swahili architecture reflect the combined influences of the Omani, Indian, and Portuguese merchants and explorers over a thousand years of spirited trade.

Shela is the small beach community that has developed in walking distance from Old Town and become a favorite refuge for celebrities and European elite who don't want to be recognised. Everyone is treated equally by locals who have welcomed visitors since the early white hunters took to visiting Lamu after their long early safaris of the 1920s and 30s. Safari-goers enjoy the laid back nature, amazing food, vibrant art scene, Swahili culture, and distinctive characters of Shela Town, said to contain some of Kenya's most expensive real estate.

Zanzibar



Area Overview

Just a short flight from the Tanzania mainland lies the idyllic Indian Ocean archipelago of Zanzibar. Famous for intoxicating aromas of spices, beautiful white sand beaches, and warm turquoise waters, the heart of the island is undoubtedly Stone Town, a fascinating step back in time with narrow winding streets, Swahili traders and local fisherman, and the daily call to prayer in this predominantly muslim town.

In addition to its fascinating Swahili and Arab history, Zanzibar offers world class scuba diving, snorkeling, fishing and, at certain times of year, kitesurfing. There is also endemic wildlife in the Johazi Forest.

Nicknamed “Spice Island,” Zanzibar was an important part of the slave and ivory trade as a connecting point between the mainland interior and the Middle East. This made the likes of some slave traders, like Tippu Tip, very rich men. A walk around the Sultan's Palace is reminiscent of this dark past. More recent pop culture will undoubtedly lead to the doorway of Zanzibar's most famous son, Queen's iconic frontman, Freddie Mercury.
